**Comments by Febeliec**

- p. 21 – 1.1.3.3.  
Febeliec is surprised that only these 2 elements (nuclear phase-out and Energy/Climate package) are listed here as having an influence on the Belgian Energy Policy. Febeliec would expect also competitiveness and security of supply to be listed on an equal level as climate and environmental issues.
- p. 29 – Emergency Plan  
As already discussed with the PFS Economy and Fluxys, Febeliec proposes to re-discuss certain aspects of the emergency plan, in order to bring it more in line with the constraints and possibilities of industrial consumers.
- p. 33 – 1.2.3.3.  
Febeliec proposes to include the Adviesraad / Commission Consultative of the CREG in the list of bodies to be consulted. This would be in line with the earlier decisions on the respective responsibilities of the CREG and the Adviesraad / Commission Consultative.
- p. 78 – 3.1.2.4.1.  
Febeliec suggests to add the impact on Belgium's CO<sub>2</sub>-emissions for these different scenarios.
- p. 89 – 3.2.2.1.  
Febeliec is surprised to read that only Synergrid is implied in the discussions on L-gas conversion. Febeliec insists on industrial end consumers being properly consulted too. We suggest to re-activate the Task Force L-gas (PFS Economy) for that purpose.
- p. 110 3.3.2.3. (L/H conversion)  
see comment to p. 89
- p. 126 – last recommendation  
Febeliec is surprised to read that the PFS Economy proposes to introduce a support mechanism for investments in new capacity for gas powered electricity generation. This issue has not been analyzed in the Study and is in contradiction with the European liberalization process of the electricity market. Febeliec proposes to take this recommendation out of the report.
