Espacenet

Espacenet is managed by the European Patent Office (EPO) in collaboration with the Belgian Intellectual Property Office (OPRI) of the FPS Economy.

Consult the database online:

The consultation is free and no registration is needed. The database is updated weekly.

Espacenet

What does it contain?

- bibliographic data and patent (application) documents;
- information about patent families (PCT, SPC, EP), indicating whether or not similar patents have been filed in other countries;
- information about the legal status of a patent, allowing you to check whether it is in force and, if so, in which countries;
- references to other types of technical literature and citations of other documents;
- links to the European Patent Register for European documents, Euro-PCT and certain national registers;
- links that allow you to inspect Chinese, Japanese and Korean patent application files.

This online tool allows you to have access to more than 90 million published documents and is equipped with an advanced search system and a translation interface.

When to use Espacenet?

- to search the scope of a patent protection, as determined by the claims and the description;
- to discover the scientific background, the technological realization or the application of a new process or product;
- to monitor the progress of technologies;
- to find solutions for your technical problems;
- to screen the latest innovations of your competitors.

What can you do with it?

- perform (simple or advanced) searches, based on different criteria;
- export results in different formats;
- manage a personal list of patents;
- use the Patent Translation Function for an automatic translation of a patent-related document;
- etc.
